FISHERS OF MEN

Pastor Kurt Hoover

And Jesus said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you become fishers of men." Mark 1:17

What do you picture when Jesus talks about fishing?

When I was eight years old, my brother and I would try to catch 15 lb carp with tiny hooks and 8 lb test fishing line. Needless to say, it did not work very well. We simply left the carp in our boat-dock-village with little brass hooks decorating their lips and a distaste for our best bait.

Little did my brother and I know we needed to get a better hook and stronger line. We focused on the bait. The carp were just sitting there at the top of the water. Turns out bread, balled up on the hook, worked the best of all our attempts. You just had to get the fish to bite before the bait fell apart.

Is that how the Gospel works? No. The Gospel is so much more powerful than that concept of fishing with bait. Yet we find ourselves thinking, "If we can just teach our people to set the hook."

When Jesus promised to make disciples into "fishers of men," they did not picture that they would be casting out a lure and hoping that someone might bite. The image for these professional fishermen was not a lure, but that of a net. The Gospel is not a bait we must get someone to bite on by their own free will and logical understanding.

The Gospel is a net. An all-powerful, all encompassing, reality that sweeps over us and captures us in the wonder of God's almighty presence.

How powerful is the Gospel? With how much attention and care must you treat this fulfilled and at-hand energy? How much do you need to be aware of what God is doing through you in order for God to use you to repent another person's faith?

It turns out the Gospel is much more powerful than we ever could imagine. It is more than a set of words or a feeling. It is a guarantee. The belief that God knows the words a person needs to hear to be set free from the empty promises currently tugging at their hip. God knows what creates trust in His promise.

And that power is not dependent on the preacher, a well-rehearsed sermon or a casual conversation. The Gospel is words of promise that sweeps over us and captures us in the presence of our Almighty God.

### CALLED TO BE SAINTS

"Paul, called by the will of God to be an apostle of Christ Jesus, and our brother Sosthenes,

To the church of God that is in Corinth, to those sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be saints together with all those who in every place call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, both their Lord and ours: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ." 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

What is a saint? When we declare, in the Apostles' Creed, that we believe in the "communion of saints," who are we talking about? Especially virtuous and long-suffering people? Martyrs and missionaries who suffered for their faith? Persons of exceptional piety and devotion canonized by church councils? I remember the girl in our church youth group who said that a saint was, "Someone you look up to and admire, but you wouldn't want to date." What is a saint?

Sainthood, as portrayed in the New Testament, applies to all who are Christians. Saints are the people of God. If you are a believer, a follower of Christ, you are a saint. You say, "Me? But I'm such a sinner." Of course you are, but we are saints not because of any personal righteousness, but because of the unfathomable grace of God. God chose you, not the other way around. As for personal righteousness, you would be hard-pressed to name a doctrinal error or a moral failing that the Corinthian church didn't possess. Yet Paul began his letter by saying that the Corinthians were, "...called to be saints..."

Christian friend, however lowly and humble you may consider yourself to be, whatever your sins and struggles, you are a saint, sanctified and set apart, chosen by God to help fulfill God's purpose in the world. How will you live out your sainthood today? As you pray, ponder how you are being called to live out your sainthood.




